NCALL's mission is: to eliminate abuse of older adults and people with disabilities by family members and caregivers by challenging beliefs, policies, practices and systems that allow abuse to occur; and to improve safety, services and support to victims through advocacy and education.

Disclaimer—NCALL staff telephoned and/or e-mailed all of the programs listed in this directory in order to gather information to provide a description of their services. These programs were in existence at the time this directory was published. Staffing and funding changes may have occurred. This directory describes programs that agreed to be listed. NCALL and WCADV are not promoting or endorsing any programs in this directory.

Introduction

“If programs like this had been around when my husband starting hitting me 52 years ago, maybe you would not have had to help my daughter or my granddaughter.”

Quote from an older women who started attending a support group for older abused women at the domestic abuse program that had worked with her daughter and her granddaughter.

Spouses, partners, adult children, other family members, and caregivers hurt older people every day in our communities. Often these victims do not know where to turn for help. Professionals and family members may not know what services are available to help older people they care about. Some agencies that might provide help include:

- **Domestic violence programs** generally offer emergency housing, 24-hour help lines, support groups, peer counseling, legal advocacy, safety planning, community education.
- **Sexual assault programs** generally offer counseling, health care advocacy, court accompaniment, support groups, 24-hour help lines.
- **Adult protective services/elder abuse agencies** generally investigate allegations of abuse/neglect and exploitation, and provide case management, monitoring and evaluation. Staff may also provide or arrange for provision of medical, social, economic, legal, housing, law enforcement or other protective, emergency, or supportive services.
- **Aging services** often can provide transportation, chore services, respite care, recreational services, financial planning, information and referral, support groups, meal services, and housing for older victims.
- **Ombudsmen** are advocates for residents of institutional facilities, such as nursing homes and assisted living.

Many of the services listed above are helpful for older victims of domestic and sexual abuse in later life. However, most of these organizations do not have services specifically tailored for these victims.

Most domestic violence and sexual assault agencies are designed for younger female victims. Adult Protective Services (APS), the aging network, and ombudsman provide services for older persons, but may not specialize in domestic abuse and/or sexual assault.

Throughout the country, some communities have created services designed specifically for older victims of domestic abuse in later life. Some domestic violence programs have hired an elder abuse specialist. Other agencies have started elder shelters or support groups for older battered women. This directory highlights these programs.

METHODOLOGY

In 2003, several methods were employed to locate programs tailored for older victims of abuse in later life for publication of the first directory. First, a short survey was put on zoomerang.com. An announcement inviting staff with programming on abuse in later life to complete the survey was posted on several national domestic violence and elder abuse list serves. Approximately 80 programs responded to this request. Next, NCALL staff called every statewide domestic violence coalition in the United States, Guam and the Virgin Islands. Staff was asked to identify programs in their state or area designed for older abused women. Many coalitions used e-mail or made phone calls to poll their members.

Using the data collected from the survey and coalition contacts, follow-up phone calls were made to every specialized program to learn more about their services. The first draft of the directory was e-mailed to the agencies listed for final approval.

This directory was first updated in 2005. Programs listed in the directory were contacted to see if they were still in existence or had expanded their services. NCALL staff also sent a national announcement on several national listserves that the directory was being updated.

To update this 2008 version of the directory, a comprehensive survey tool was available on Survey Monkey to gather data about programs and existing services. NCALL staff announced that the directory was being updated on national list serves and contacted all programs previously listed. Staff made follow-up emails and calls as needed to gather more information.

WHAT IS IN THE DIRECTORY

For this directory, a broad definition of “projects focusing on abuse in later life” was used. Specialized programs include:

- A domestic violence organization with an elder specialist
- A domestic violence organization with specialized outreach to older persons
- Support groups for older abused women
- Elder shelters
- APS, aging network, or elder abuse agencies having specialized programming, outreach or materials on domestic violence and/or sexual assault

Projects were not included if they provide general services to younger victims of domestic violence, but are willing to serve older victims. Most domestic violence and sexual assault programs throughout the United States will not turn away older victims. However, if the organization did not have specialized services, they were not included in this directory. Likewise, APS, elder abuse, aging network, and ombudsman programs often serve older victims of abuse. However, if the services were not designed specifically for older abused women or did not focus on abuse in later life, these programs were not included. To find any of these general programs, national and state numbers can be found in this directory and on page 13.

HOW TO USE THIS DIRECTORY

The table of contents on page 9 provides an overview of the directory. National hotline and resource numbers on domestic violence, sexual assault, elder abuse, abuse in later life, and ombudsman can be found on page 13. Next, each state’s listings can be found in alphabetical order.

For each state, the state’s domestic violence coalition, sexual assault coalition, elder abuse hotline and adult protective services contact information are listed under General Resources.

General services for victims of domestic violence, sexual abuse or elder abuse can be found by calling the national numbers on page 13 or contacting a statewide agency listed by state throughout the directory.

For states that have specialized services for older victims, the agency name, address and phone number are listed under the Specialized Programs heading. A brief description of the program has also been included.

The next section of the directory lists several categories to help the reader find specific types of services. The appendices give the organization name, address, phone number, and website address.

We recognize this initial attempt to highlight projects throughout the country may have missed some projects. We apologize to any programs on abuse in later life that were not included in this directory.

NCALL defines victims of abuse in later life as women and men age 50 and older who have been harmed by someone with whom they have an ongoing, relationship with an expectation of trust (e.g., spouse, partner, adult child, family member, or caregiver). The forms of abuse can include a variety of tactics, including, but not limited to, physical, sexual, and emotional abuse, financial exploitation, neglect, intimidation, and coercion.

Some programs in this directory define abuse in later life and/or their target population differently from NCALL. Contact the programs directly to learn their eligibility requirements.

Finally, projects included in this directory self identified as addressing domestic abuse in later life. The descriptions are based on interviews with staff. Over time, contact information and services may have changed.
